STUDENT HOUSING NEEDED

Difficulties experienced by many of the 5,100 students expected to attend Humboldt State College this fall have prompted an appeal to local community residents for assistance in locating housing for students, particularly married couples.

HSC Housing Director Bill Kingston said, "basically, our greatest need now is for unfurnished apartments or small houses for married students, some of whom have children, in the rental range of \$80 to \$125 per month, preferably in the Arcata area but including Eureka and McKinleyville."

Householders or landlords with vacancies available are requested to telephone the HSC Housing Office at 826-3451 to obtain a listing card which they may fill out and return to the College. These cards will be displayed in easy access to those seeking housing. Interested persons may also visit the Housing Office in the Jolly Giant Commons to fill out cards.

Kingston noted that on-campus accommodations for 1,022 single students will be in use this fall. This includes 400 in the Jolly Giant Complex, 400 in the Redwood and Sunset Halls, 72 in the Humboldt Village portable group, and 150 new spaces as an addition to Humboldt Village. A waiting list for on-campus housing numbers 800 students.

Areas adjacent to Humboldt Village are being prepared for 25 new portable units, 13 for men on a plot west of the Humboldt Village lounge and 12 for women east of the lounge. Six students will be assigned to each unit, and the accommodations are scheduled to be ready for occupancy by Monday, September 29, the first day of instruction.
