Ecological and Human Health Impacts of the Marijuana Industry in the Emerald Triangle

This symposium will gather social and natural scientists to discuss the environmental and human health impacts of the marijuana industry in the Emerald Triangle.

Researchers and practitioners specializing in some of the lesser-known topics around marijuana production – land use, pesticide use, water quality, and other environmental impacts – will provide some perspective on important issues that are often left out of mainstream discussion and political analysis of the marijuana economy. Panelists will propose a more constructive and progressive approach to ensure environmental and human health protections.
